Candidates must report for check-in and the Candidate Orientation at the first time listed on the verification letter (<https://www.optometry.org/verification/>); the exam session ends at the second time listed.

IDENTIFICATION FORM REQUIRED

To be admitted to the test center, you must present an acceptable form of picture identification that includes **both a photograph and a signature**. The **only** acceptable forms of identification are:

- A valid driver's license or an official photo ID issued by the government of the state or province where you reside.
- A valid passport.
- A valid student identification card from an accredited school or college of optometry, provided this ID card includes **both a photograph and signature embedded in the card**.
- In order to be considered valid, the ID must match the name used to register for the exam.

ID Forms from membership organizations or clubs are not permissible for admission to any National Board test.

TEST SECURITY

This examination is being administered to fulfill certain licensure requirements for the participating state boards. The National Board takes seriously its responsibilities to assure that Candidates are assessed only on their ability. To avoid any collaboration between Candidates during a session or breaks between sessions, no discussion will be allowed between Candidates during these times. Any question(s) that you may have must be addressed directly to the Chief Examiner or a member of the examination staff. The National Board reserves the right to dismiss any Candidate from any examination session if this condition is breached.

CANCELLATION OF EXAMINATION

If it is necessary to cancel the Clinical Skills Examination due to circumstances beyond the control of the National Board (such as severe weather conditions or power outages), the examination will be rescheduled at the earliest opportunity and with the same general schedule. If local conditions suggest that the examination may be cancelled, it will be the Candidate's responsibility to consult the NBEO web site, www.optometry.org, and/or call (800) 969-3926 for a recorded message regarding any examination schedule change.

TEST CENTER

You may park in the Illinois Eye Institute parking lot at 3241 S. Michigan Ave. However, you must enter the Illinois College of Optometry through the Indiana Avenue entrance. This entrance has a small circular driveway and revolving doors which is on the other side of the building. You will have to walk around the block if you park in the clinic parking lot. The exact address to the entrance you must use is 3240 S. Indiana Avenue, Chicago, 60616. Please pay strict attention to posted signs and do not enter the college through the clinic entrance.

SCORES

Once scores are released and able to be viewed online (<https://www.optometry.org/scores/>), we will immediately post an announcement on our homepage (<http://www.optometry.org/>) under "News and Notes"; scores are not available until this announcement is made. Scores will be available for Candidates to view no later than **October 11, 2010.**
